




from the Board Chair and Executive Director

The Palo Alto urban forest continues to flourish and school yards in East Palo Alto will soon have beauty and shade as never before.

Now in our 17th year, Canopy continues

to provide tree advocacy, community services, landscape improvements, and education throughout Palo Alto and East Palo Alto. We do this because we know that beyond the multiple environmental benefits trees offer, they improve our quality of life.

Laura Martinez, Mayor of East Palo Alto Canopy was instrumental this year in the hiring of Walter Passmore as the City of Palo Alto's first Urban Forester. As early advocates for the creation of this position, we assisted the City in developing an attractive job description and participated in the recruitment panels. Lured away from Austin, Texas, Walter has the passion, expertise, and experience to implement the City's Forestry Program in the 21st Century. He will lead the completion of the Urban Forest Master Plan, which will ensure that valuing the beauty and tangible benefits of the Palo Alto urban forest is deeply rooted in all levels of City government.

Our Healthy Trees, Healthy Kids! initiative addresses the green gap at local schools, primarily in East Palo Alto. With 613 trees planted at schools so far, most of them in the Ravenswood City School District, we are well on our way to our goal of 1,000 new trees for

kids. Along with each tree planting, Canopy engages all students on these campuses in treecentric hands-on natural history lessons and activities.

Each of our programs invites community members of all ages to appreciate and understand community trees, to learn how to plant and care for them, and to give us a hand when volunteers are needed. This year our plantings and tree care workdays, educational offerings, and Arbor Day Festival attracted more than 3,000 people.

We are proud of our accomplishments and happy to share with you, our growing community of volunteers, supporters and partners, the two noteworthy awards received in the past year: the Stanford Community Partnership Award and the California Urban Forests Council Award. Your generous gifts of time, talent, and resources are creating a living green legacy for generations to come.

2012 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Canopy is making a profound impact on the urban forests of Palo Alto and East Palo Alto with hundreds of trees planted annually. The payback we get from each tree we plant includes shade, reduced energy costs, cleaner air, diminished greenhouse gasses, improved water quality, and simple beauty.





Planting Trees

With the planting of 255 trees, Canopy brought our grand total to 2,659 trees planted since our founding in 1996. Our annual Palo Alto Mayor's Tree Planting took place at Gunn High School this year with alum Yiaway Yeh.

Sharing Insight and Knowledge

We reached hundreds of people with educational messages and information at a variety of community events. The Palo Alto Arbor Day Festival at Mitchell Park was full of fun family activities and learning opportunities. We kicked-off our series of popular arborist-led Tree Walks and workshops with a Tree Talk by arboriculture thought leader Prof. Matt Ritter of Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. We added 774 high quality photos of local trees to the free online Canopy Tree Library.

Engaging Youth

Canopy engages youth in tree stewardship educational programs in schools and through the Canopy Youth Staff Program, which hires East Palo Alto high school students as Urban Forestry Technicians. Trained by professional ISA-certified arborists, the Youth Staff plays a





significant role in caring for our urban forest and educating others about trees.

Caring for Trees

Canopy Youth Staff and volunteers continued their annual surveying, weeding, watering, mulching, and pruning of young trees in Palo Alto and East Palo Alto. As a result of this care, the trees we plant enjoy an exceptionally high survival and establishment rate.

- 160 volunteers gave 668 hours

Advocating for the Urban Forest

Working with local administrations and school disticts, we promoted the preservation of mature trees, designed and implemented tree planting projects, and recommended the selection of drought-tolerant and climateadapted trees. Canopy was instrumental in the successful hiring of Palo Alto's first Urban Forester and assisting the City in multiple projects such as the replacement of a 200 year old heritage oak loved by the community. We also helped the City of East Palo Alto obtain funding for its first ever street tree inventory and canopy analysis. We advocated at the state and national levels to elevate the profile of urban forestry and the recognition of our work. This year we attracted the annual statewide Urban Forestry conference to Palo Alto and our Executive Director was elected to the board of California ReLeaf.



2013 GOALS

Canopy believes that growing our urban forest is one of the wisest, high-yield investments we can make in our community. We plan to continue planting and safeguarding our urban trees while engaging and educating residents. Kids and schools remain the priority in our 2013 plantings—we're creating healthier, more inspiring learning environments for our children.

Creating Outdoor Equity - Planting Trees for All Kids

Canopy plans to plant 230 new trees on seven local school campuses. By transforming barren school grounds into verdant sanctuaries we provide kids with better learning environments, bring much-needed shade to play areas, increase energy efficiency of school buildings, break up heat islands, and provide healthy fruit snacks. Planting trees on school campuses brings us closer to "canopy equity" in our schools.

Inspiring a New Generation of Environmentally Literate Kids

We'll strengthen youth education programs by updating our curriculum for elementary, middle, and high school plantings, classes, and workshops. We'll also reach out to more schools to help kids become environmentally literate problem solvers, better prepared to be good stewards for the future.

Advocating for the Urban Forest

Canopy brings together City government, school districts, and businesses, all of whom play a



critical role in planting, growing, and protecting our urban trees. Canopy will continue to provide advice and guidance to the Cities of Palo Alto and East Palo Alto to ensure that the urban forest is safeguarded and grows. We'll work at the state and federal legislative levels through our active involvement in California ReLeaf and Alliance for Community Trees.

Engaging the Community

Since local municipalities tend only to City trees, the community plays an important role in maintaining our urban forest. The care that residents provide to trees in their yards is invaluable. Canopy will engage people of all ages and provide relevant, expert information, and training to the public in species selection, planting, and tree care techniques.



PILOT PROGRAM: Evaluating an Irrigation Product

for Future Large Scale Plantings

Canopy has started conducting test plantings with DriWater, an innovative irrigation method. Buried around tree roots, DriWater gel pacs gradually release water to hydrate the roots. The gel packs are less expensive to install and use less water than traditional irrigation systems. Thanks to a grant from the Dean Witter Foundation, Canopy monitors the trees planted with this product to assess the potential for larger scale use of DriWater.

With 613 new trees in the ground, we have passed the halfway marker

in our initiative to plant 1,000 shade and fruit trees on school campuses and parks in Palo Alto, East Palo Alto, Menlo Park, and neighboring communities by 2015. Schools with trees boast higher scholastic achievements, reduced rates of mental and physical health problems (depression, early onset diabetes, and obesity), and a more positive sense of school, place, and community.



Fiscal Year 2012 Financial Summary *

Total revenues for the year reached \$503,745, while operating expenses were \$346,917. We were able to transfer the majority of the surplus to reserves and carry forward funds for program expenses to be used in fiscal years 2013 and 2014.

As always our dedicated volunteers were important in making plantings, tree care, and other programs possible. Although not accounted for in the financial statements, the total value of volunteer hours can be estimated at more than \$115,000.
