Americorp Public Allies Position: Environmental Educator

Canopy is a growing urban and community forestry nonprofit with a track record of delivering high quality, innovative, and impactful programs. Canopy staff and volunteers strive toward excellence, equity, collaboration, and gratitude in the work we do, and welcome candidates that share these values. We are seeking a hard working, dedicated person to join our team and grow with us as we aim to accomplish our vision: a day when every resident of the Midpeninsula can step outside to move, play, and thrive under the shade of healthy trees.

Position Summary

This is a position through the [Americorp Public Allies Program](#). Under the direction of Canopy's Education Director, the Environmental Educator will be responsible for Canopy's growing K-12 lessons at schools in East Palo Alto, Menlo Park, Palo Alto and Mountain View. A balance of office work and fieldwork can be expected. Every person on the Canopy team is expected to collaborate on shared goals. Work week will be Tuesday through Thursday, and Saturday, with early mornings and evenings on occasion.

Duties and Responsibilities

Program Coordination:

- Develop and implement systems for scheduling environmental education lessons with district administrators, principals, teachers and parent groups at schools in Canopy's service areas.
- Create new ways to recruit and manage Canopy's growing corps of education volunteers to assist with delivery of education programs.
- Design evaluation tools to gather feedback from students and teachers and use Canopy's database to track and report program outcomes.
- Upgrade, create, purchase, and maintain program materials.

Program Instruction:

- Plan, prepare, and teach approximately 80 inquiry based, hands-on science lessons to over 2,000 students.
- Update curriculum as needed to achieve Canopy's desired education outcomes, align with school curriculum, and better support NGSS.
- Research and maintain a current knowledge of the evolving field of environmental literacy, hands-on and inquiry-based education, and STEM.
- Occasionally engage youth and families through educational tabling activities at Canopy and community events.
- Work with Education Director to identify and use self-reflective tools and exercises for setting personal goals and evaluating own growth as an environmental educator.

Qualifications and Experience

- Bachelor's degree in education, science education, environmental science or related field.
- 6+ months experience working as an educator with K-12 youth.
- Knowledge of environmental subject matter or a sincere desire to study and learn.
- Excellent classroom and behavior management skills.
- Ability to adapt teaching style and content to meet the diverse needs of students.

- Strong public speaking skills: loud voice with clear enunciation and pacing — presenting in a confident, engaging manner that draws in the audience.
- Demonstrated commitment to professionalism, cultural competency, and equity in education.
- Preferred: experience with NGSS and Common Core standards.
- Preferred: experience working in school classrooms.
- Preferred: fluency in Spanish.

Personal Characteristics

- Detail-oriented, organized, with outstanding interpersonal skills.
- Able to communicate effectively verbally and in writing with diverse groups.
- Ability to work collaboratively and openly communicate with coworkers.
- Positive, flexible, and friendly.
- Independently driven team player.

Physical Activity Requirements

- Ability to sit and type, frequently.
- Ability to bend, squat, stoop, and stand for long periods of time, regularly.
- Ability to lift up to 50 lbs., occasionally.
- Driving to and around neighborhoods where work is being performed.

Compensation

Allies are paid with a \$16,000 stipend in bimonthly installments for their term of service, and are awarded a \$5,920 Education Award for successfully completing the program with 1700 hours of service.
